Resulting from the Conference and Public meetings held since the Conference it has become apparent that LCWF formulates a new strategy to enable the County Forum to become an independent organisation, with a complete rebrand and image to enable the Watch movement to respond to the Communities needs at all times, involve young people diverse communities, to ensure the County of Lancashire is safe, secure and a County that is caring in Community safety conscious at all times.
